## **Monbulk PS Alumnus visits**

Last Friday we were visited by a former student, 93 year old Josephine Suey (nee Eddie). Josephine started at MPS in 1932, around 15 years after the school was rebuilt by fire. I was able to take Josephine and her family, who were visiting from NSW, on a tour of this historic building where she saw her old classroom and reminisced about her time here. Josephine said '*The girl on the farm next door started going to school, so I wanted to as well. My mother agreed, thinking the three mile walk there and back would discourage me. So there I went to school at 5 years old with my neighbour, and came home. The next day I was dressed for school again, much to my mother's surprise! So I started going to school. In those days the school went up to year 8'.*

# Phone Messages

Please be aware that school assembly is held every Friday 3 to 3:30pm outside. It is very difficult to deliver phone messages to your child during this time.

# Sick Bay Messages

We will now be using Compass to send a **notification text message** to families when their child attends sick bay. This replaces the Sick Bay slips of paper which did not always make it home at the end of the day.

The text message will have a brief description of the issue, such as 'minor cut' or 'head knock'. You are welcome to call for further information if needed. Often students are treated, if required, and then sent back to class for monitoring. Families will still be called when a student needs to be taken home or for further medical attention. Rest assured our first aid treatment remains the same, we're only changing how we communicate attendance at sick bay.

WHY IS PARENT MEMBERSHIP SO IMPORTANT? Parents on school councils provide important viewp and have valuable skills that can help shape the dire of the school.

DO I NEED SPECIAL EXPERIENCE TO BE ON SCHOOL COUNCIL?

Each member brings their own valuable life skills innoviedge to the role. Councilors may need to dew skills and acquire knowledge in areas that are untann to them. What you do need is an interest in your ch scheol and the desire to work in partnership with other help shape the school's future.

#### HOW CAN YOU BECOME INVOLVED?

The most obvious way is to vote in the elections, are held in Term one each year. However, balls only held if more people nominate as candidate there are positions vacant. In view of this, you might consider

 standing for election as a member of the school council encouraging another person to stand for election.

WHAT DO YOU NEED TO DO TO STAND FOR ELECTION?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Cal for Nominations following the commencement of Term one each year. All school council elections must be completed by the end of March unless the usual <u>sme</u>. Lise has been warded by the Minister.

If you decide to stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or you can nominate yourself in the Parent category.

Department employees whose child is enrolled in a school in which they are not engaged in work are eligible to nominate for parent membership of the school council at that school.

Once the nomination form is completed, return it to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election





# FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

### INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

# HOW TO APPLY

v applicants should contact the school office t ain a CSEF application form or download from ad from the website below

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings

commencing this year Check with the school office if you are unsure



Monbulk Recreation Reserve - Construction Works for Stormwater Harvesting System

As part of the Council's capital works expenditure program 2022/23, we wish to advise of construction works at Monbulk Recreation Reserve.



The stormwater harvesting system at Monbulk Recreation Reserve will supply around 4 million litres per year of treated stormwater to irrigate the sports oval. The system will consist of a 310,000-litre underground tank and UV disinfection unit to supply treated stormwater to the oval. This will reduce reliance on potable mains (drinking) water supply and improve water quality in Emerald Creek. This creek is a high priority waterway for stormwater management and supports a breeding platypus population.

Temporary fencing will be installed next week with some works commencing on Friday 17th February 2023. Excavation for the underground tank will commence during the first week of March 2023. The stormwater harvesting system is expected to be completed by June 2023.

Access to the sports oval, skatepark, pavilion and other amenities will be maintained at all times. However, due to the nature and extent of the works there will be some restricted access to the north of the oval during the works. The contractor will provide ongoing traffic management and advice to motorists.
