Car Park Congestion

Returning from the holidays we can be a little rusty about the pick up arrangements at MPS, so it is timely to remind families about the arrangements, particularly school pick. These arrangements are in place to help children be collected from school guickly and safely, and to minimise disruption to the town. There is not enough parking available to accommodate our school population, and queuing for school pick-up can cause gridlock throughout the town. This often happens on rainy days.

To help school pick-up run smoothly for MPS and the town please consider:

- parking at the skate park or Pavilion and walking up
- arranging a meeting place other than the Hub carpark
- plan to pick up children a little later; the yard is supervised until 3.45pm

When using the Hub car park:

- If standing in the Kiss & Drop zone do not park or leave your car. You must remain with your car to leave as soon as possible and allow other parents to collect their children
- Turn left out of the car park to keep traffic flowing. Police are monitoring this and will be enforcing due to the disruption to the

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

EDUCATION

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world words while sports teach tearmwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- · \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

w applicants should contact the school office t ain a CSEF application form or download from

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
 changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings. commencing this year


Sushi and Sausage Roll Thursdays




