On ANZAC Day our School Captains, Scarlett Thorp and Macca Norris, led our part of the Monbulk ANZAC March. They held a wreath, and a photo of a Monbulk ANZAC, Francis William (Frank) Roberts. I was very proud of our student leaders, and all students who attended the march and ceremony. They represented our school and town with pride and respect.

At our ANZAC Assembly on the first day of term we welcomed Mr Bill Ford, President of the Monbulk RSL, and Mr Daryl Bristowe, a Vietnam Veteran to help lead our observance.

The student leaders told us about Frank Williams and his story. Each year we will learn about an ANZAC from Monbulk to help the children understand the stories and sacrifice of those who served. The whole school showed outstanding respect during the assembly.

Honouring Francis William (Frank) Roberts

His name is Francis William Roberts, but everyone called him Frank. His name is written on the Honour Boards near the library, but he's not just a name; he has a story. Frank was born in Albert Park, and enlisted on the 23rd February 1916 at the rank of Private. He was with the 21st Battalion, 19th Reinforcement.

Frank was 27 years old when he boarded the ship called Ascanius on the 11th May 1917 with the rank of Sergeant. On the 14th November 1917 he left for Paris. He fought in the trenches through the great push of 1918.

Before leaving to fight in the war Frank married Ruby, and learned that she was pregnant as he was heading off to war. Frank's daughter Nancy was born on November 1917, when Frank was joining the 21st Battalion in England. As the war reached it's most fierce fighting in 1918, Ruby sent Frank one of little Nancy's booties, and kept one at home with her. She was waiting and hoping for Franks return, to bring the bootie with him. It's wasn't to be. Frank Roberts was killed in action on the 9th September 1918. The bootie was returned in the post, with the package marked 'undeliverable'.

Frank served 2 years and 4 months with the 21st Battalion before being killed in action.

Frank came from our Monbulk community. He represents for us the ANZAC spirit, the sacrifices of all those who have fought for us, and the grief and loss of war. We honour the memory and legacy of Francis William Roberts today, and of all who have served.
