## **Principal's Report**

## **Bushfire Safety and Sweat Day Timetable**

Monbulk PS is part of the Department's Bushfire At Risk Register (BARR), which proactively manages and mitigates the risk of bushfire attack. This also means that when our Local Government Area (LGA) is classified as Catastrophic, we will close. Often the bushfire rating for the District, which is a much larger area, is published.

This understandably causes some confusion. DET is updated twice a day about the bushfire risk to BARR schools, and we are promptly notified of any risk, and communicate this to our school community. Other schools have a different plan which is informed by their Bushfire Attack Level. Families are encouraged to enact their own Bushfire Survival Plan. Any school closure or relocation will be communicated to families as soon as possible to assist with planning.

Items to action on Compass and notices sent home

On very hot days we are using a 'Sweat Day Timetable'. This includes closing the Oval and opening the Senior Building for quite play, requiring students to play in the shade, and basketballers to take their drink bottles to

the courts.

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcome

## FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible fam to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary If you note a valid means-rested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- . \$150 for primary school students
- . \$250 for secondary school students

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

### (Formerly **Schedule 4:** Notice of Election and Call for Nomination)

An election is to be conducted for members of the school council of Monbulk Primary School

Nomination forms may be obtained from the school and must be lodged by 4.00 pm on: 4th March 2024

The ballot will close at 4.00 pm on: 4th March 2024

Following the closing of nominations a list of the nominations received will be posted at the school.

The terms of office, membership categories and number of positions in each membership category open for election are as follows:

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORY	TERM OF OFFICE	NUMBER OF POSITIONS
Parent member	From March 2024 To March 2026	6

If the number of nominations is less than the number of vacancies, there will be no need for an election.

What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school, in accordance with Ministerial Order 1280 Constitution of Government School Councils, and the Education and Training Reform Act 2006. In doing this, a school council may directly influence the quality of education for students. Who is on the school council?

For most primary school councils, there are several possible categories of membership:

A mandated elected parent member category – more than one-third of the total members must be from this category. Department employees can be parent members at their child's school providing that they are not engaged in work at the school.

A mandated elected school employee member category – members of this category make up no more than one-third of membership. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

An optional community member category - members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experience. Department employees are not eligible to be community members. small number of school councilshave **nominee members**.

For all schools with a Year 7 and above cohort, there is an additional category of membership:

A mandated elected student member category, two positions.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

### Why is parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills and a range of experiences and knowledge that can help inform and shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

Do I need special experience to be on school council?

Each member brings their own valuable skills and knowledge to the role, however, in order to successfully perform their duties, councillors may need to gain some new

skills and knowledge.

It is important to have an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

Code of conduct for school councillors
School councils in Victoria are public entities as defined by the *Public Administration Act 2004*.
School councillors must comply with the Code of Conduct for Directors of Victorian Public Entities issued by the Victorian Public Sector Commission. The Code of Conduct

is based on the Victorian public sector values and requires councillors to: **act with honesty and integrity** – be truthful, open and clear about their motives and declare any real, potential or perceived conflict of interest and duty **act in good faith in the best interests of the school** – work cooperatively with other councillors and the school community, be reasonable, and make all decisions with the

best interests of students foremost in their minds act fairly and impartially – consider all relevant facts of an issue before making a decision, seek to have a balanced view, never give special treatment to a person or group and

use information appropriately – respect confidentiality and use information for the purpose for which it was made available exercise due care, diligence and skill – accept responsibility for decisions and do what is best for the school

use the position appropriately – notuse the position as a councillor to gain anadvantage act in a financially responsible manner – observe all the above principles when making financial decisions comply with relevant legislation and policies – knowwhat legislation and policies are relevant for which decisions and obey the law

demonstrate leadership and stewardship – set a good example, encourage a culture of accountability, manage risks effectively, exercise care and responsibility to keep the school strong and sustainable.

Indemnity for school council members
School councillors are indemnified against any liability in respect of any loss or damage suffered by the council or any other person in respect of anything necessarily or reasonably done, or omitted to be done by the councillor in good faith in:

the exercise of a power or the performance of afunction of a councillor, or the reasonable belief that the act or omission was in the exercise of a power or the performance of afunction of a council.

In other words, school councillors are not legally liable for any loss or damage suffered by council or others as a result of reasonable actions taken in good faith.

How can you become involved?
By participating in, and voting in the school council elections, which are held in Term 1 each year. However, ballots are only held if more people nominate as candidates than there are positions vacant. In view of this, you might consider: standing for election as a member of the school council

## encouraging another person to stand for election. What do you need to do to stand for election?

The principal will issue a Notice of Election and Call for nominations in Term 1 of each year. Council elections must be completed by 31 March, unless varied by the Minister for Education.

you stand for election, you can arrange for someone to nominate you as a candidate or, you can nominate yourself in the parent member category. You can only be nominated by another member of the same electorate that you are eligible for (e.g. a member of the parent electorate may only nominate another parent of that elec-

Department employees with a child enrolled at a school where they are not engaged in work, are eligible to nominate for parent membership at that school.

Return your completed nomination form to the principal within the time stated on the Notice of Election. You will receive a Nomination Form Receipt via post, email or by hand delivery.

Generally, if there are more nominations than vacancies a ballot will be conducted in the two weeks after the call for nominations has closed.

Remember

Consider standing for election to school council.
Ask the principal for instructions if you are not sure what to do.
Be sure to vote if the election goes to ballot.
Contact the principal if you are unsure about what is required at any stage of the election process.

This program gives students the opportunity to learn how to sing in a choir, develop vocal skills and build confidence in performance each week.







Re: Supporting the Dandenong Ranges after the extreme weather event

Dear Resider

I hope this letter finds you well during these challenging times.

I am writing to let you know about the efforts being made by the Allan Labor Government to support Victorians affected by the catastrophic weather event that occurred on February 13th, 2024.

We know that the impact of this event has been significant for many residents across the hills and footbills, with homes and vital transmission infrastructure damaged, and widespread power outbooks.

Premier Jacinta Allan has announced additional support for thousands of Victorians who are still without never

- The Albanese and Allan Labor Governments are implementing a <u>Prolonged Powe</u>
   Outage <u>Payment</u> program. Eligible households without power for seven days
   following the storm <u>can receive \$1,920 per week for up to three weeks</u>. This will
   be administered by energy distribution businesses.
- Small businesses can access \$2,927 per week for up to three weeks.
- The waste levy will be completely waived for storm-impacted residents across
  Yarra Ranges, Cardinia and Knox Local Government Areas until April 30, 2024.

Efforts are still underway to ensure all customers have access to power, with generators being prepared for distribution. Priority will be given to the most vulnerable individuals facing prolonged power outages.
