Principal's Report

Honouring our ANZACs

Recently we honoured our ANZACs through a number of events in and around the school. Our Student Leaders attended the Dandenong Ranges ANZAC Commemoration, and laid a wreath at the Kokoda memorial on behalf of Monbulk PS. On Wednesday we welcomed Mr Surridge and Mr Beard from the Monbulk RSL to lead our commemoration during our assembly. During this time we also learned about a Monbulk ANZAC, James Alfred McAllister. On ANZAC Day students and student leaders participated in the Monbulk ANZAC March, carrying James McAllister's picture and our wreath, on behalf of Monbulk PS. Classroom teachers also taught lessons on our ANZACs and why we remember. It is a very special time for our school community to learn about those who have served and sacrified, and give us the life we enjoy today. I was very proud of all of our students as they showed respect and compassion.

Honouring James Alfred McAllister

We are going to learn about someone from Monbulk who went to World War 1. His name is James Alfred McAllister. You might recognise his last name from McAllister Road. The McAllister's are a very important family in Monbulk. His name is written on the Honour Boards near the library, but he's not just a name; he has a story. James was one of eight children born to Lily and James McAllister. James was named after his father and they called him Jim. He was 5 feet and 6 inches tall and had brown eyes and brown hair. James was one of five brothers; Jim, Charles, George, Harold and Robert. All five brothers enlisted in World War 1; that means they volunteered to fight.

James enlisted on 12th January 1917 in the rank of Private in the 39th Battalion, 7th Reinforcement. He was 36 years old. He was assigned to the ship HMAT Ballarat, which set sail for the war on 19th February 1917.

James' time in the war was brief but eventful.

On ANZAC Day 1917, a couple of months after they set sail, his ship was torpedoed in the English Channel. Fortunately all on board were picked up by a Destroyer. Later that year, in September, he marched into Rouelles in France.

One month later, in October, he was wounded in action in Belgium. Whilst he was fighting he had a gunshot wound to his left eye, also injuring his cheek. He became blind in his eye, and a piece of the bullet stayed behind his eye.

He returned to Australia on January 10th 1918, and was discharged from the Army in April.

He died in Monbulk in 1937 at 57 years old from the injury to his eye.

James came from our Monbulk community. He represents for us the ANZAC spirit, the sacrifices of all those who have fought for us, and the grief and loss of war. We honour the memory and legacy of James Alfred McAllister today, and of all who have served.



We acknowledge and pay respect of the Wurundjeri people of the Kulin Nation, their Ngurungaeta-Murrundindi, and their Elders, as the Traditional Owners of the land on which our School stands.



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A GUIDE FOR PARENTS

SOME SUGGESTED ACTIVITIES

MILC

The following are some activities that you can do with your children. Some are general and some relate to specific aspects of the mathematics curriculum.

LENGTH

We often compare objects and distances by length and height. Children can first do this without using units, then using informal units (like paces). Then they learn about metres, centimetres and kilometres. Also:

- When you are measuring with sewing or building materials, ask the children to estimate where a particular mark would be
- Put up a height measurer marked in centimetres on which the children can record their height at progressive intervals, such as once every two months. The children take an interest in the way that they grow,

and it also provides a language for describing how their height is changing.

 Discuss lengths, heights, distances, angles which arise in sporting events (e.g., the Olympics)

WEIGHING

Children learn first to compare things by hand, and by using balances. Later they learn about kilograms, and grams. You can:

- Talk to children about different ways of weighing things
- · Talk about containers in terms of how much they weigh
- · Compare the size and weight of items in the supermarket
- Using language of heavier or lighter when comparing the weight of items
- Ask them to find something that might weigh the same as a packet of rice, for example
- Weigh ingredients when you are cooking (learning to cook is helpful in many ways).
