BUSHFIRE SCHOOL PROCEDURE

Monbulk Primary School listed on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR) as we are at risk of bushfire attack. As such, there are special arrangements and requirements for the maintenance and operation of the school.

Monbulk Primary School will be closed when a **Catastrophic Fire Danger** has been declared by the Bureau of Meteorology for the **Central District**.

Monbulk Primary School may be closed when an **Extreme Fire Danger** has been declared by the Bureau of Meteorology for the **Local Government Area (LGA)** of the Yarra Valley.

We provide families with as much notice as possible of a closure by SMS message and Compass notifications. Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, regardless of improvements in the weather forecast. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child.

A Friendship Ninja stands up for themselves and their friends. A Friendship Ninja makes new friends and understands that friendships change, and that's okay.

Above all else, a Friendship Ninja is someone you want to be friends with because they're true to who they are!



FRIEND-O-CYCLE

The normal cycle of conflict in a friendship.

FRIENDSHIP FIRE®

Normal conflicts like hurt feelings, disagreements, and misunderstandings.



FRIEND-O-METER

A visual tool that helps assess how we are feeling in our friendships.



MEAN-ON-PURPOSE

Intentionally cruel, rude, malicious behaviour that is designed to hurt someone.



4 FRIENDSHIP FACTS

A set of four facts that help us have realistic expectations in our friendships so we understand what is normal.

1. No friendship (relationship) is perfect.
2. Every friendship is different.
3. Trust & Respect are the two most important qualities of a friendship.
4. Friendships change... and that's okay!



QUICK COMEBACK

A very short word or phrase that is used when someone is Mean-on-Purpose.

Quick Comebacks are designed to let the other person know that you heard/saw what they did and you're not okay with it.

REPORTING SCHOOL PROGRESS

A discussion between parents and teachers is the most effective method for reporting progress. We use continuous online reporting through Compass to keep parents up to date with their child's academic progress.

Each semester, we will provide you with the opportunity to book a parent-teacher interview with your child's classroom teacher as well as their specialist teachers. However, if at any time you wish to discuss your child's work or provide information that may be affecting progress or wellbeing, please email your child's teacher to arrange a mutually convenient time to meet.

WELLBEING



Student Wellbeing is an important part of student learning and development. Our **Wellbeing Leader** is Jade D'Atri. Mrs D'Atri leads and oversees our student wellbeing program, Mental Health in Primary Schools, and Inclusion and Disability support and programs.



Our **Chaplain**, Janet Hergt, provides wellbeing programs such as Art Retreat, Girls Power, Boy Power, Friendship Group and 1:1 pastoral care. The Wellbeing Centre is a safe space for children to go and access Wellbeing support, take part in programs, or just spend some quiet time.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Punctuality and Attendance

Help your child to be punctual. School begins at 8.50am and it can be an unsettling experience for young children to walk into class late. If your child arrives at school any



time after 8.50am they are required to sign in at the office to record their attendance at school. Your child will receive a welcome pass at the office which they give to their teacher, this informs the teacher that your child has been signed in at the office.

If your child arrives home during school hours, please notify the school immediately.

Absences

If your child is absent from school, please add an attendance note on the Compass App or phone the office on the morning of absence, there is a designated phone line for this purpose dial 9756 6481 then press 1 to leave a message. You will receive a text message after 10.30am if your child has been marked absent and no explanation note has been recorded on the Compass App.

If you need to sign your child out before the end of the school day, please report to the office before collecting your child.

Illness

If your child is ill, please keep them at home. We have a sick-bay for students suddenly taken ill – please note the emphasis on suddenly. If your child is not fit to attend school, it is not acceptable to send them. A sick child cannot learn or function effectively in the classroom.

Behaviour Expectations and our Values

At Monbulk Primary School we use School Wide Positive Behaviour Supports.

Our school values are explicitly taught to students, and students are recognised and rewarded for showing our school values. When students do not show our values, this disrupts the learning of others and can impact the learning and wellbeing of others in our school community.

Our behaviour expectations are taught through our behaviour Matrix.

Medicines

If your child is taking or has prescribed medication, we request that you either arrange to dispense the medicines at school yourself, or collect a Medication Authority form from the office, whereby the medication will be dispensed at the office, as per doctor's instructions. Asthma inhalers can be stored in the First Aid Room or in your child's school bag if they can self-administer; all families are required to supply the office with their current Asthma Plan signed by a GP every year.

Sun Smart

The School's Sun Smart Policy requires all children to wear a wide-brimmed hat during outdoor activities, such as P.E., recess and lunch times, during Terms 1 and 4. Sunscreen is accessible for students who wish to use it.

Wet Day & Sweat Day Timetables, Recess and Lunch Play Activities

On days of extreme heat or rain, students are welcome to play indoors at recess and lunch play, supervised by the yard duty teachers. These are called 'Sweat or Wet Day Timetable' Please note, children will be playing in light rain, raincoats are required on these days.

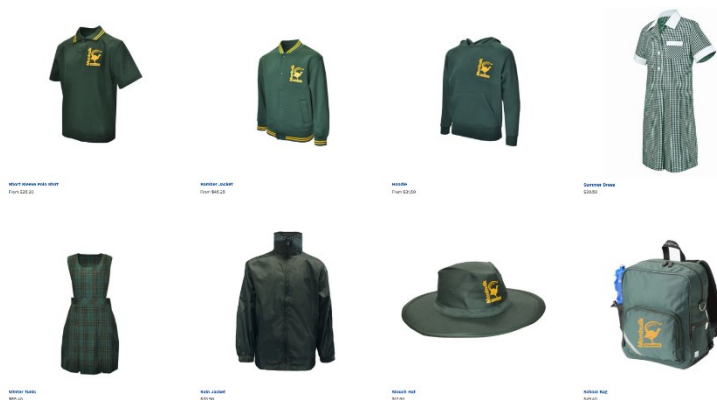
On normal temperature days we offer:

Uniform

Uniform is available for purchase online at www.spartanschoolworld.com.au or from Spartan School World Retail Shop located at 1/210-214 Canterbury Rd, Bayswater North. Online orders may be delivered direct to your home for a small fee or a weekly delivery to the school free of charge. There is also a small collection of 2nd hand uniform available for sale at the school office.

Our uniform includes a Green Bomber Jacket or Hoodie, polo top, checked tunic dress and green hat which can be purchased from Spartan. Other items of our uniform are available from general department stores.

Monny Mag – Our School Newsletter

Most communications from school are via Compass, by email or text notifications.

Scholastic Book Club

Scholastic Book Club catalogues are sent home throughout the year. This is a great opportunity to purchase quality books at reasonable prices. Orders can be made online (see catalogue for details) otherwise cash payments and order forms need to be returned to the school by the due date, in an envelope marked clearly with your child's name and grade. Books generally take about three weeks to be processed and delivered. *Cheques are no longer accepted.* Scholastic Book orders are processed by a parent who volunteers their time.

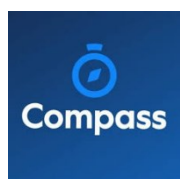
Curriculum Contributions

The curriculum contribution for 2026 is **\$280.00** for Prep – Grade 6 children. This includes access to Netbooks, S.T.E.M. and the Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Programs. Compass is our online platform allowing you to access up-to-date information about school events, excursions, camps, curriculum contributions and your child's progress. We use Compass as the main communication between parents and teachers.

The portal is accessible via the web and also through the Compass School Manager App (available for download via the App store on your device).

Your login details and the installation guide will be provided to you once enrolment has been processed and confirmed.



QKR (pronounced Quicker!) is another online payment platform that we use for fundraising activities, camps and curriculum contributions. Further information about QKR is included in the enrolment pack or at the office. Thursday Lunch orders can only be made from the QKR App, view food menu items in the Canteen Tab.

Parking

We share the carpark between the school and the Living and Learning Centre. Please take note of the parking signs and be mindful of other patrons using the car park. Parking is NOT Permitted in the Kiss and Drop, and all traffic should turn left when exiting the car park. The flow of traffic through the car park should never be blocked, if there is no space to pull into the kiss and drop zone please vacate the car park and rejoin the cue. PREP STUDENTS - PREPARING FOR SCHOOL

Assessment Week

From Friday the 29th of January to Wednesday the 3rd of February 2027, Prep students will be booked in for an assessment session with their teacher. This will last about 1 hour.

This time helps each child's teacher understand the entry level of literacy and numeracy for each student. Interview times will be advised via email late December/early January.

For Preps the first day of school starts on **Thursday 4th February, 2027**. School commences at 8.50am with students dismissed at 1:00pm each day of their first week at school.

Thursday 11th February, 2026, Prep students will start full days at school finishing at 3.10pm.

Please note these dates may change on confirmation of enrolment numbers.

BEGINNING SCHOOL

Below are some recommendations to prepare your child for what will be one of the most important transition stages of their life.

It is important to discuss the coming event with your child, to ensure that they feel happy and relaxed about starting school.

A social story, 'Beginning School' will be posted to you in January for you to read together with your child. The purpose of this will be to help your child get ready for school. Helping your child to master certain skills before schools starts will assist in an easy adjustment.

Please refer to the social story 'Beginning School' for suggestions.

- Encourage your child to look forward to school by highlighting positive aspects of their new experience.
- Try to avoid talking in a way that may make your child apprehensive or let your own anxieties be reflected in your child.
- Encourage your child to take care of and be responsible for their own belongings. At first children need lots of time to learn to do these things independently; please allow them extra time in the short term as it will reap rewards in the long term. For example, give your child plenty of opportunities to practise independently putting on and taking off their socks and shoes, tying up shoelaces, doing up buttons and zippers, and pulling up their pants.
- Name **all** your child's personal belongings with a waterproof marker, i.e. Clothes, lunch box and lid and drink bottle. This helps us return items to your child when they are misplaced.

Your child will find school easier if they have started to learn to:

- Say their full name and address
- Put their things away after finishing
- Recognise and care for their named belongings
- Go to the toilet and adjust clothing independently
- Flush the toilet after use and wash hands
- Use a tissue or handkerchief properly
- Cover their mouth with elbow when coughing or sneezing
- Take off their jumper/jacket independently
- Pack and zip their school bag & open and close their lunch box and use their drink bottle

WHAT YOUR CHILD WILL NEED TO BRING TO SCHOOL

All these items are essential and will be needed from the first day of school. These items are available to purchase from Spartan School World (See Uniform section for more details)

Yellow Hat for Prep – Green Hat for Grades 1 to 6

Prep students will receive their complimentary yellow Prep hat, marked with our school logo as well as their name for easy identification in the last session of Step into Prep in December, the year prior to commencing school.



Hats are required during outside play times and activities at school (During Term 1 and Term 4) for all students.

Please note that a green full brim hat is required to wear for all students in Grade 1 -6. Hats are

School Bag

Please ensure the bag you purchase is a decent size. Our school bag sold through Spartan is a good size, hard wearing and supports their back.



Art Smock

Spartan have ready-made Art Smocks for the junior grades available to purchase. The senior grades are encouraged to bring an old business shirt or something similar to protect their school uniform.



Big Green Satchel – Prep to Grade 2 only

To keep notices neat and safe whilst also keeping classroom readers separate from borrowed library books. Great for sending notes between teacher and parents. This PVC satchel is available from Spartan.



Chair Bag - Prep to Grade 2 only

Chair bags store your child's work and belongings in their classroom. The preferred material for your child's chair bag is denim/heavy cord. When decorating the chair bag with fun designs please include your child's name for easy identification. Denim chair bags are available from Spartan.
